**Entity's Purpose or Mission** 

The Marlborough Migrant Centre enables migrants, newcomers and local people to celebrate their diversity in a safe and welcoming environment so that people of all ethnicities feel empowered, with a sense of connectedness and belonging.

#### **Entity Structure**

The Marlborough Migrant Centre has a Board who govern the organisation. They set the strategic direction of the organisation. The Board is supported by 2 part-time paid employees. The employees manage the Centre and provide the services to the community. Volunteers are utilised to supplement the centre when major events are being organised (for example, the annual Multicultural Festival)

### Main Sources of Entity's Cash and Resources

The main source of revenue is from Grants from Marlborough District Council and Donations from organisations such as Rata Foundation and NZ Lotteries.

### Main Methods Used by Entity to Raise Funds

The main method of raising funds is by applying for grants and donations from various entities, as above. This is supplemented by unsolicited donations from the community and providing Intercultural Awareness Training.

### Entity's Reliance on Volunteers and Donated Goods or Services

All of our board members are volunteers. Other activities, such as the Multicultural Festival and international celebrations rely on volunteer assistance to organise and run the events.

### **Statement of Service Performance**

## Marlborough Migrant Centre Incorporated For the year ended 30 June 2017

'What did we do?', 'When did we do it?'

### **Description of Entity's Outcomes**

One of the key benefits of our services is the reduction of social isolation, and enabling people to "settle well". We assist in building positive relationships between the host community of Marlborough and migrant communities. This moves Marlborough towards being a healthier, safer and more caring, inclusive, connected and engaged community. Specific outcomes for migrants who have settled well are that they

- face less risk of social isolation,
- know where to go to seek support and access services,
- have an opportunity to celebrate and share their own cultural identity,
- and gain a sense of belonging.

For the host community we aim to see agencies better equipped to assist migrants, and a greater sense of the benefits that cultural diversity brings to the wider Marlborough community. This includes the economic benefits to Marlborough, as we depend on migrant input in terms of provision of labour and skills. Our services help migrants and the host community to integrate, build understanding and community resilience and contribute to their new community.

Through the Marlborough Migrant Centre's provision of wrap around advocacy, migrants feel they have a place to go when they approach other agencies, and that they have someone from the host community who is there to support them.

### Description and Quantification of the Entity's Outputs

Newcomers Network gatherings (to reduce social isolation and build connectedness) - 9 morning teas with an average of 30 people attending, 1 pot luck tea with over 50 attendees

Multicultural Festival (acknowledging Race Relations Day) - featuring 27 performers (groups counted as 1 performer), 15 food stalls and 12 information and craft stalls, over 4,000 people attended

International Women's Evening - featuring cultural items, a speaker and celebration of ethnic food, 140 people attended

Cultural Celebrations - for example Thai New Year, Korean New Year and Chinese New Year, and an Indian cultural performance at local retirement village.

Training / Community Education including development of the Volunteer Training Project, and Are you confident driving in NZ? workshop.

Lastly, Client Services recorded 943 contacts with migrants from 51 different countries. The contacts are grouped into Advocacy & Support (employment, health and welfare advocacy), External/Community Relations and Training/Community Education.

### **Additional Output Measures**

Marlborough Migrant Centre's advocacy and wrap-around services help migrants experiencing problems with things such as housing, health, welfare, work or immigration.

### **Statement of Accounting Policies**

## Marlborough Migrant Centre Incorporated For the year ended 30 June 2017

'How did we do our accounting?'

### **Basis of Preparation**

The entity has elected to apply PBE SFR-A (NFP) Public Benefit Entity Simple Format Reporting - Accrual (Not-For-Profit) on the basis that it does not have public accountability and has total annual expenses equal to or less than \$2,000,000. All transactions in the Performance Report are reported using the accrual basis of accounting. The Performance Report is prepared under the assumption that the entity will continue to operate in the foreseeable future.

#### Bank Accounts and Cash

Bank accounts and cash in the Statement of Cash Flows comprise cash balances and bank balances (including short term deposits) with original maturities of 90 days or less.

#### **Fixed Assets and Depreciation**

All fixed assets are recorded at cost less accumulated depreciation.

Depreciation of the assets has been calculated at the maximum rates permitted by the Income Tax Act 2007.

Office Equipment is depreciated on Diminishing Value basis at rates between 12% and 50%

### Receivables

Receivables are stated at their estimated realisable value. Bad debts are written off in the year in which they are identified.

#### Investments

Investments are carried at the lower of cost or net realisable value.

#### Goods and Services Tax (GST)

The entity is registered for GST. All amounts are stated exclusive of goods and services tax (GST) except for accounts payable and accounts receivable which are stated inclusive of GST.

### Income Tax

Marlborough Migrant Centre Incorporated is wholly exempt from New Zealand income tax having fully complied with all statutory conditions for these exemptions.

### Revenue

Revenue is recognised when it is able to be measured reliably. The Marlborough Migrant Centre's main source of Income is from grants and donations received from Government departments (for example Department of Internal Affairs - Lotteries) and community organisations (for example Rata Foundation). Grants are recognised as revenue when they are received, unless the funds are tagged for a specific purpose. If the funds are tagged, the revenue is recognised as the grant is spent. Unspent funds are retained as a liability on the Statement of Financial Position.

### **Changes in Accounting Policies**

There have been no changes in accounting policies. Policies have been applied on a consistent basis with those of the previous reporting period.
